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1. Season Overview

Bentleigh Lakers, a child safe Club, is a member of the McKinnon Basketball Association (MBA), and we place teams in the MBA's domestic competition.

The age groups for Summer 2024-25 and ball sizes are:

Under 8	Born 2018, 2019 (must turn 5 before start of competition) Size 5 ball
Under 10	Born 2016, 2017 Size 5 ball
Under 12	Born 2014, 2015 Size 5 ball
Under 14	Born 2012, 2013 Size 6 ball
Under 16	Born 2010, 2011 Boys: size 7 ball, Girls: size 6
Under 18	Born 2008, 2009 Boys: size 7 ball, Girls: size 6
Under 20/Senior	Born 2006, 2007 Men: size 7 ball, Women: size 6

2. Child Safety

Bentleigh Lakers is a Child Safe Club. Every person in the basketball community has a responsibility to understand their role in ensuring the safety and wellbeing of all children and young people in our care.

All our volunteers must abide by the relevant Code of Conduct and those aged 18 and over must have a valid Working with Children Check, abide by the Club's Child Safe Code of Conduct and complete online Child Protection and Safeguarding training.

All members and volunteers are expected to immediately advise the Club's Child Safe Officer, Jo Morley, at registerforlakers@gmail.com of any concerns that they may have about the welfare of a child.

3. How to Register

Registration is via PlayHQ, a registration system run by Basketball Victoria and used by most basketball clubs in Victoria.

If registering an EXISTING player or you already have a PlayHQ account, **DO NOT** create a new PlayHQ account, please use your existing account. This causes all sorts of issues down the track.

Note: for the Summer 2024-25 season, girls born in 2006 and 2007 will play in the Senior competition.

Registration opens August 18th and closes midnight September 8th.

NOTE: Early Bird, Committee, Coach and AGC discounts are available (see Fee Section below).

If the player is **transferring from another Club** associated with the MBA, you'll be prompted to trigger a transfer request which will be sent to the 'from' and 'to' clubs and the MBA. Once all approvals have been given, you'll receive an email advising that registration can be completed. This approval process may take a couple of days.

4. Fees & Costs

Registration Fees for the season are as follows and will be charged as a total amount during registration:

Club Registration Fee - Early Bird – August 18th to 8pm August 25th	\$285 	You must register within the Early Bird period to receive the discount. Coach, committee, AGC and multiple child discounts are available – see below
Club Registration Fee – 8pm August 25th to September 8th	\$300	Coach, committee, AGC and multiple child discounts are available – see below
Basketball Victoria Annual Participant License Fee	\$29 (= <17) \$43 (= >18)	This fee is charged by Basketball Victoria and covers a 12-month period. More information is available at https://www.basketballvictoria.com.au/play/registration-information If the player’s current license expires during the Winter 2024 season, you’ll be charged this fee.
McKinnon Basketball Association Fee	\$90 (Junior) \$45 (Senior)	This fee is set by the McKinnon Basketball Association and covers the stadium entry for the player and unlimited spectators for the normal rounds (exc. finals). No fee will be charged at the stadium entrance.
Basketball Australia Game Development Levy	\$5.50	This is an annual fee to support the growth and development of basketball. More information is available at https://www.australia.basketball/news/3739877/game-development-levy

Multiple Child Discounts: When registering, you’ll receive a **10% discount** on the Club registration fee for each subsequent player registered under the same PlayHQ account. This will be applied automatically.

Coach, Committee and AGC Discounts: A voucher code will be sent to all **compliant** coaches, Committee members and AGCs to be used at registration time. Coach discounts range from **25% to 100%** of the Club Registration Fee depending upon credentials and number of seasons coached. Note: Junior coaches and non-playing adult coaches will also receive an end-of-season payment.

Get Active Kids Voucher

The Get Active Kids Voucher Program is a Victorian Government initiative which helps eligible families get their kids involved in organised sport and active recreation activities. Eligible children may receive up to \$200 to cover the cost of registration.

Currently, there is no active round open. If a round is announced and you’ve already paid your registration fee you can get a reimbursement by going to <https://www.getactive.vic.gov.au/vouchers/>

Final's Team Sheet Fee:

Semi Final **\$80 per team**, Grand Final **\$85 per team** (this may change slightly). The upfront player registration fee does not cover finals costs. Each team that reaches the final will be required to pay the Team Sheet fee at the stadium door or arrange to pay to the MBA prior to the final. Team Managers should arrange collection of this fee prior to the game.

Stadium Entry Fee:

Stadium entry fees (excluding finals) are charged upfront by the McKinnon Basketball Association as part of the registration process (refer Association Fee mentioned above) and this will cover entrance for all players and spectators for all rounds except finals.

For finals, the stadium entrance fee will be **\$3 per player and per spectator over 18**. Senior card holders will be \$2.50 and Team Coach enters for free.

Uniform (shorts & singlet): \$100 – refer uniform section (this is not part of the registration process)

Refunds:

Registering to play with the **Bentleigh Lakers** signifies an ongoing commitment to the club for the upcoming season. A player withdrawal after registration is very disruptive not only to individual teams but the entire age group and creates considerable work for the volunteers on our committee. 5. New Player Session

A New Player Session will be held on **September 11th**. At this session, our Age Group Coordinators will assess players' skills to ensure they're placed in the right team. More information about the New Player Session will be sent to all new players by email in due course.

6. Uniforms

Existing Players – if ordering a new singlet, please use the Player's existing Club Approved Singlet Number – DO NOT CHOOSE A NEW SINGLET NUMBER

New Players – MUST have a Club Approved Singlet Number before ordering a uniform. This will be allocated by the Club after registration and advised by email. **Players cannot choose their own number.**

Uniforms must be ordered by **September 10th** to ensure delivery before the start of the season. Uniforms ordered after this date will not arrive before the start of the season. The Club will try and organise a loan uniform but if one is not available, the player can wear plain navy/black t-shirt and shorts (no zippers, buckles, pockets) for the first 4 rounds without team penalty.

Sizing charts are also available in the online shop, or you can contact the Club at registerforlakers@gmail.com to try on samples.

Uniforms will be delivered to the Club, and you'll receive an email arranging collection. When ordering, there is also an option, at a cost, to have the uniform mailed directly to you.

If you wish to use a 2nd hand uniform/hand-me-down, please get Club approval at registerforlakers@gmail.com to ensure there'll be no number clash in your child's age group.

7. Teams, Selection Policy and Player Points System

After registrations close, the Age Group Coordinators will form teams based upon their knowledge of the players and in accordance with the Club's Selection Policy which aims to:

- Ensure the enjoyment of all players within the club – through equal participation,
- Place players in teams appropriate to their current or future skill level and development,
- Develop all players to the maximum of their ability, and
- Field competitive teams in all divisions in each age group.

For teams with VJBL representative players in them, the team composition will need to comply with the MBA's **NEW Player Point System**. More information can be found on [page 6 of the MBA's Domestic Handbook](#).

Each team will have a Coach as well as a Team Manager. You can indicate during the registration process if you'd like to take on these roles. We can't run the Club without these important roles.

The Age Group Coordinator will advise team details by **October 3rd**. This will include details about the coach and the training day/time/venue.

As a community-based basketball club, we rely heavily on parents/guardians/siblings/relatives/friends to volunteer as a coach. Like many clubs, we struggle to find coaches, so please consider taking on this role. We offer support for coaches through training and on-line resources.

8. Training

Training is on a weeknight and runs for around 45 minutes. Our training venues are Valkstone, McKinnon and Hughesdale Primary Schools.

We have over 100 teams to schedule and therefore we can't be precise about training days/times until teams are formed and coaches appointed. During the registration process you can advise what days/times don't suit and we do our best to accommodate but there are NO guarantees.

The Age Group Coordinator will advise teams and training day/time/venue by **October 3rd**. Training will commence the week starting Monday **October 7th**.

Please don't send your child to train if they're unwell.

Players should bring their own drink bottle and wear appropriate sport attire and shoes.

Our training venues are under licence, and we must respect the schools' rules. In general:

- The stadium is only to be used for the allotted training time.
- We have access to the basketball court, toilets and designated entry/exit area. No other area is to be used including other rooms within the stadium and school grounds/playgrounds.
- No school equipment or furniture is to be used or moved.
- No players/children are to be on school premises unless an adult is present. Parents are to remain with their children until the coach arrives.
- Siblings are to remain seated and supervised by parents at all times.

9. Competition, Fixtures and Bylaws

Bentleigh Lakers places its teams in the competition run by the MBA. Games are held on the following days:

- U8 boys and U8 mixed teams play on Saturday mornings.
- U10 to U18 boys play on Saturdays.

- U20 boys play on Sundays.
- U8 to U18 girls and Senior girls play on Sundays. If there are not enough teams to form an U8 Girls competition, then the MBA may require teams to play in the U8 Saturday competition.

The day starts with the under 8 age group and finishes with the oldest age group. The U8s play at Bentleigh Secondary College. All other games are at a variety of venues including GESAC, Bentleigh, McKinnon and Brighton Secondary Colleges, and Coatesville Primary School.

The U8 Competition will have modified rules:

- 4 x 4 competition i.e., only 4 players on court per team.
- 1 coach per team is allowed on the court to guide players.
- 2 x 15-minute halves.
- 1 x 3-minute half time break -all players from both teams shoot a free throw for an opportunity to add to team score (if individual score limit has not been reached).
- No grading and no separate divisions (separate groups may apply depending on team numbers).
- Individual scores will not be published online (PlayHQ).
- Round 15 on March 15th/16th will be a Round Robin format. These will be the last games for the U8s.
- U8s will not participate in the Semi finals (March 22/23) or Grand finals (March 29/30)

Fixtures will be released week to week for the first 4 rounds of grading.

Your Team Manager will advise you about the game details on a weekly basis

The season will have **15 rounds plus finals** as per the table below. The first 4 weeks are **grading rounds** for the U10s to U20s, and teams may move between divisions within an age group and game times/venues may change. These will be normal rounds for the U8s. We recommend that you check the fixture each Friday during the grading rounds.

10. Parent Scoring Duty

All parents are expected to take turns at scoring during the season. The Team Manager will set up a roster.

There are 2 scoring mechanisms:

- The clock – which displays information on the court scoreboard. Usually the 'away' team does this (away team is the second named team on the fixture)
- The iPad – which records statistics which will be uploaded to PlayHQ by the referees after the game. Usually the 'home' team does this.

There will be instructions on the scoring bench.

Key points to remember when scoring:

- Get there early so you have time to check the players and singlet numbers and familiarise yourself with the scoring instructions of the score table.
- Compare scores on the clock vs iPad regularly during the game to ensure they're the same. If there is a discrepancy, this must be resolved at that time. The referee can be called over to resolve a dispute. If the discrepancy isn't resolved, then the iPad takes precedence.
- Sometimes statistics are lost when being uploaded after the match, so it's always a good idea to take a photo of the iPad screen.
- Fill in players must have all their details entered correctly.
- Players must not play under another player's name.

11. Code of Conduct
